Assembly District 6: **Shirley Hinze** was secretary of American Legion Auxiliary 492, on the board of the Harbor Advisory Commission in Marquette, a Boy Scout leader, and a Sunday School teacher. She says, "In the 10 years I've been here [in Shawano], this community has voted Republican. I live in this community, and what do we get? Nothing. They keep voting for this and this, and there's nothing coming back into the district. Two things made our state — lumber and farming. We can't lose that. We can't lose our farmers."

Assembly District 56: **Emily Tseffos** attended Edgewood College in Madison and obtained a degree in Elementary Education with a certificate to teach English as a second language. She taught in Mexico and Nicaragua before returning to Wisconsin, where she taught language arts and literature. She became chair of the Outagamie County Democratic Party in 2021.

Assembly District 57: Mother of three, grandmother of nine, retired teacher, and volunteer **Ruth Caves** says, "I worked in the Wild Rose School District in various roles: librarian, English-Language Arts teacher, reading specialist, and union member and officer." The current chair of Waushara County Democrats has been active in the community — especially with St. Paul's Lutheran Church, Kiwanis, Waushara Gardeners, and Theda-Care Wild Rose Volunteers.

Assembly District 87: **Bill Switalla** says, "I grew up on a family farm and now run a small business in Wittenberg. I am the President of the Village of Wittenberg and represent District 24 on the Shawano County Board. I am a moderate Democrat and proud of it."

State Senate District 2: Former journalist **Kelly Peterson** says, "Madison isn't working for the vast majority of working Wisconsinites. Families are searching for affordable, accessible childcare. Family farmers are continuing to be squeezed out of business. And, time and time again, women are demanding that their representatives protect their fundamental right to bodily autonomy. I'm running because your voice matters and, if elected, I'll carry that voice to the State Capitol and deliver for hard-working families."

Congress District 8: Obstetrician-gynecologist **Dr. Kristin Lyerly** is a sixth-generation Wisconsinite. She says, "Nobody wants a politician making their personal health care decisions for them, whether we're talking about when you get your preventive care screening or whether you get cancer treatment."

Note: The November 5 election this year includes a Special Election to choose the District 8 Representative for the rest of 2024. Since she is running for the office, her name will be on *two* ballots: One for the term that will end in December (to complete the term represented by Mike Gallagher, who left that office April 20). One for the term that will begin January 3, 2025 and last for two years.
